### Jendaya Conure

#### Aratinga Jandaya

- **General info.** ....One of our favourites!! If you want a small bird that is always on the go, good fun, acrobatic, affectionate and totally entertaining and stunningly pretty, then this is the bird for you.
- Jendaya conures are found in Thorny bush areas, farmland, fields etc sometimes in quite large flocks. They look very similar to the Sun Conure and are quite often confused. They are found in North Eastern Brazil. They are fairly common as aviary birds in Britain. Only in recent years have people started breeding these conures more frequently. They are not regarded as endangered in the wild. They are no longer imported into Europe due to the E.U. Ban on wild caught birds
- **Adult size.** .....30cms ( 11 -12in).
- **Sexing.** ....The sexes are alike, although some males have slightly larger flatter heads and larger beak.
- **Talking ability.** Conures can be regarded as moderate talkers and mimics of whistles and household sounds.
- **Life span.** .... Jendaya conures can live for 10 to 15 years possibly more.
- **Diet.** .... Jendayas require a good parakeet mix. Fresh fruit and vegetables and fresh water daily. Vitamin and mineral supplements.
- **Pros for choosing a Jendaya conure .**
- Jendayas are extremely intelligent,
- Become devoted to their keepers,
- Small in size.
- Moderate talking ability,
- Exceptionally entertaining,
- Playful, mischievous disposition,
- Good family pet.
- Beautifully coloured
- **Cons for choosing a Jendaya conure.**
- Can be a bit nippy just after weaning but this stage soon passes.
- Can be slightly noisy,
